WORSHIP GUIDE FOR THE SEASON OF LENT

Welcome to worship at St. John's Lutheran Church!

Through Word and Sacrament, we are God's people rooted in the abiding presence of our Lord, Jesus Christ, and empowered to serve by God's Holy Spirit!

Responding to the Good News of Christ, we live out our calling as people of faith.

Here at St. John's, our Mission Statement expresses our grace-empowered desire to be disciples in our everyday lives:

“Encountering, Connecting, Responding to Jesus Christ.”

We give thanks to God for this day and the opportunity to gather together as God's family to be fed with the Word and the Meal that sustains us for daily life!

For the Hearing-Impaired:

The T-Switch must be activated on your hearing aid.

Health Emergency Notes:

If anyone needs **glucose**, or juice for a **hypoglycemic medical emergency**, juice boxes are available in the small fridge in the Meet and Greet Room (Room 118), just around the corner from the sanctuary. Glucose tablets and gel are in the **First Aid Kits** in the *Entrance area coat room*, and in the *kitchen in the Fellowship Hall*. Please let a staff member know if you use any, so that they can be replaced right away!

In the unfortunate case of heart failure, our **DEFIBRILLATOR** is located across the hall from *Room 111 (Youth Ministry Office)*.

Holy Communion

Pattern for Worship

In the principal service of Christian worship, the Holy Spirit gathers people around the means of grace: the saving Word of God and the sacraments. From the table of communion where Jesus Christ meets us with forgiveness, life, and salvation, we are sent out to share God's love and to care for those in need.

The basic pattern of this service — gathering, word, meal, sending — is a structure that allows for freedom and flexibility in the ways worship may be shaped locally, while focusing on what the church holds in common. The whole people of God are joined by the same gifts of grace, for the sake of the same mission of the gospel, into the life of the one triune God. Remember, people of all faiths are welcome at the Lord's Table. You may also come forward for a prayer of blessing from our pastor.

Why Do We Have Liturgy?

Our liturgy forms a pattern that is familiar and repetitious in order to help us frame our minds for a fuller worship experience. As steps in a dance free you to express yourself in music, the patterns in liturgy free us to express ourselves spiritually. There is comfort in repeating phrases and prayers each week, and liturgy — literally the “work of the church” — frames our collective experience each time we gather. We hope you find peace, strength, and comfort in the liturgy we have designed for you today!



GATHERING

The Holy Spirit calls us together as the people of God.

Our prelude music is designed to help you and your neighbors to relax, settle in, and immerse yourselves in some quiet time with God before we begin our worship service.

This is also a good time to double check your portable devices to make sure they are on “mute.” We hope this prelude music will enhance your worship experience and bring peace to your soul.

God gathers us in Christian assembly. We confess our sin and hear God’s word of forgiveness.

Confession and Forgiveness

Pastor Trusting in Christ’s promise of forgiveness, let us now turn our hearts toward God in humble confession.

Silence is kept for reflection. Please kneel or sit.

Pastor Gracious God,

All You are our breath and our very life. We are the work of your hands, the children of your creation. We confess that we have often turned from you and sought our own path through life. Forgive us our offenses, and cleanse us from proud thoughts and empty desires. By your grace draw us near to you, that you may be our refuge and our strength; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Pastor God, who is rich in mercy, loved us even when we were still far away, and has given us new life through our Lord Jesus Christ. By grace you have been saved, and in the name of the Father, and of the † Son, and of the Holy Spirit, God now forgives you all your sins!

All Amen.

Singing at the gathering may include hymns old and new, a prayer for God's mercy to fill the church and the world, or a canticle of praise to God's glory revealed in Jesus Christ.

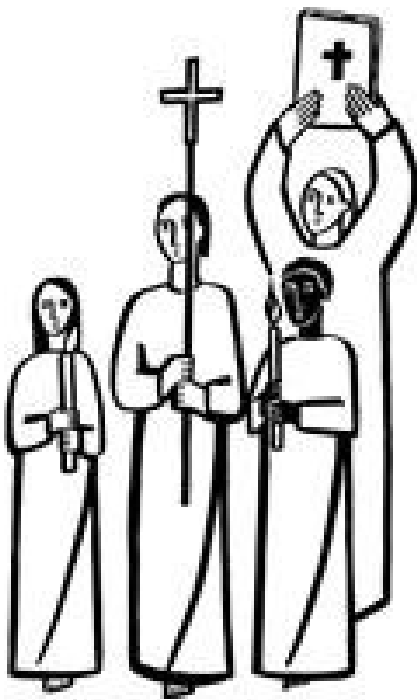
Gathering Hymn (see insert)

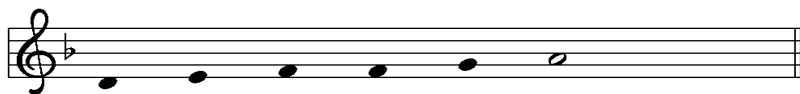

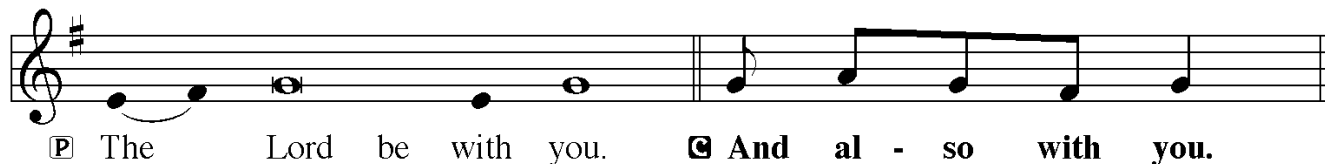

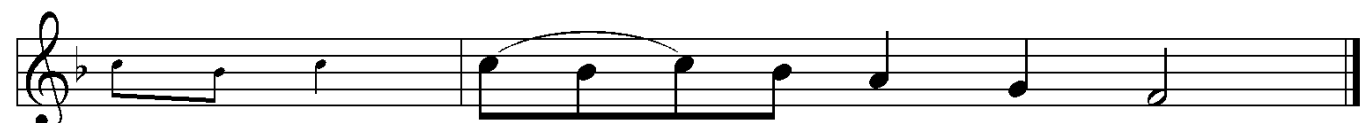

The congregation is seated.

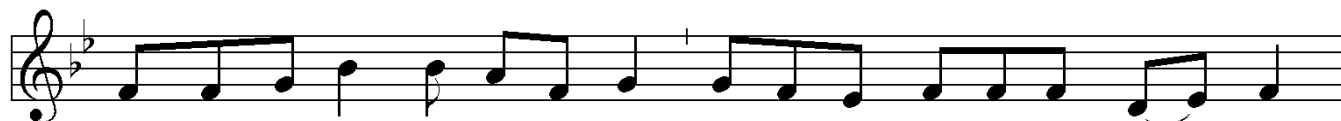
Announcements

to those unable to come forward. Please tell an usher of this need.*



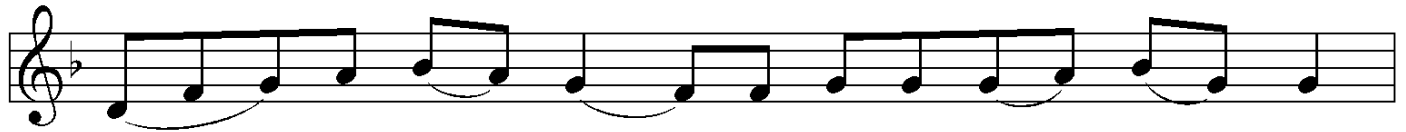

The gift of God's grace is always proclaimed in Jesus' own words of command and promise at the table. A full thanksgiving also includes praise to God for creation and salvation, remembrance of the crucified and risen Christ, and prayer for the Holy Spirit in this meal. The thanksgiving concludes with the prayer our Lord Jesus taught us.



Pastor Blessed are you, almighty and ever-living God. Your mercy is everlasting and your faithfulness endures from age to age. We give you thanks that you have gathered us into one through your Son, Jesus Christ, who reached out to heal the sick and suffering, who preached good news to the poor, and who, on the cross, opened his arms to all. Send now your Holy Spirit into our hearts, that we may receive our Lord with a living faith as he comes to us in his holy supper.

All Amen! We give you thanks and praise, O Lord!

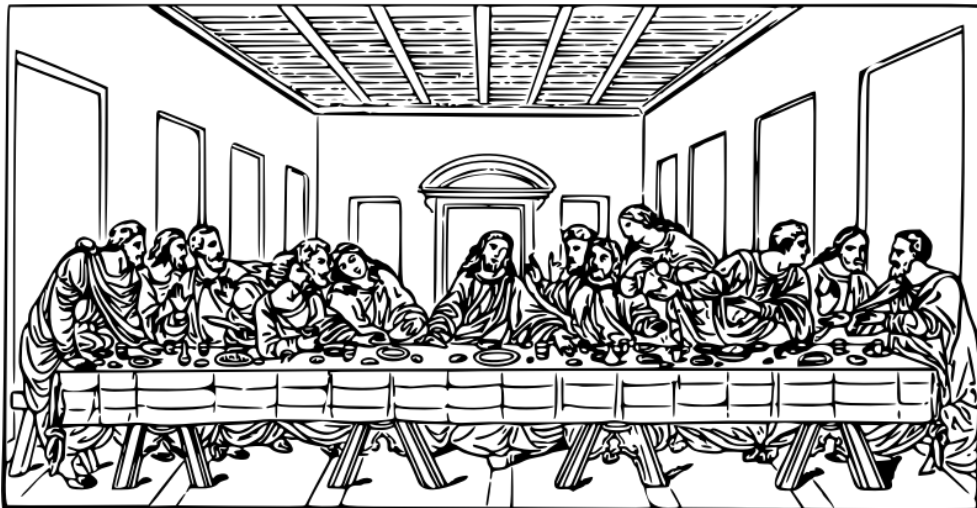
Pastor On the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying:

This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Remembering, therefore, his death, resurrection, and ascension, we await his coming in glory. Pour out your Holy Spirit, that by this Holy Communion we may know the unity that we share with all your people in the body of your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. Through him, † with him, in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor are yours, Almighty God, now and forever.

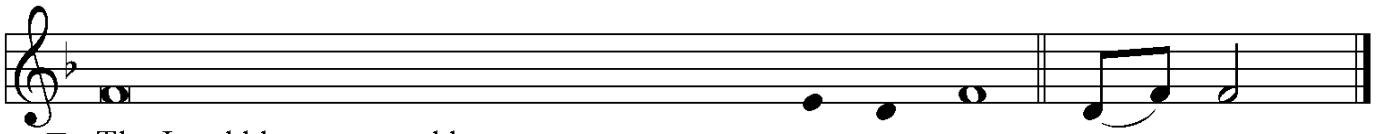

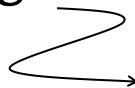
